

Dear Brother Knights,

I am reaching out today to ask for your support in promoting and contributing to a program that is truly making a difference across the Commonwealth — the **Pennsylvania State Council Labels Program**.

The Labels Program plays a vital role in providing much-needed funding to several important initiatives throughout Pennsylvania. Through your generosity, we are able to support:

- **Special Olympics Pennsylvania**, which empowers individuals with intellectual disabilities through sports and inclusion,
- Vocations programs in each Diocese of Pennsylvania, helping to foster and support men discerning the priesthood, and
- Local councils across the state that send delegates to the annual State Convention, ensuring representation and unity among our members.

Each of these causes benefits directly from the success of this program — but unfortunately, we are facing a significant shortfall this year.

As of today, we are **approximately \$20,000 behind** where we were at this point last year. This is concerning, especially considering the level of need and the number of people who count on our support.

In March, the Labels Committee mailed out **approximately 55,000 sets of labels** to members of the Knights of Columbus across Pennsylvania. To date, **only 2,912 members** have responded with a donation. We are incredibly grateful for those who have already contributed, but we know that with your help, we can do better.

That is why I am personally asking each of you to **promote this program within your councils** and to **encourage every member** to participate. My challenge is simple:

If every recipient of the labels were to send back just \$1, we could cover this gap and ensure the continued success of the programs we support. Of course, donations of any amount are deeply appreciated and will go directly toward these meaningful causes.

The 2024–2025 Labels Program will conclude on **June 30, 2025**, so there is still time to make a difference. Let's finish strong.

Thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to the mission of the Knights of Columbus. Together, we can make a significant impact on the lives of those we serve.
